1. Bishop Tonnos Catholic Secondary School - <i>"Waste Watchers"</i> 20110262	To reduce waste in the school and implement a more effective recycling program.	\$500.00
2. Sir Winston Churchill Secondary School - <i>"The Greening of Roxborough Park School"</i> 20110263	To plant native tree species for shade at the elementary school and to teach the younger students the importance of maintaining native tree species in our urban area.	\$700.00
3. Sherwood Secondary School - <i>"Going Greener"</i> 20110264	To expand the garden areas in front and back of the school and to plant low maintenance native plant species. Purchase more compost bins and conservation stickers to put near light switches/faucets.	\$700.00

9. Highland Secondary School - <i>"Food from Scratch - Greening Highland from the Inside"</i> 20110270	To purchase a small greenhouse that can be used to plant heirloom vegetable seeds.
